There are a number of things you can do at home to help a student that has dyslexia.

- Read to and with your child at home everyday. This exposes your child to reading more often and also helps your child develop listening skills.
- Listen to audio books. They are another great way to help with listening skills.
- After reading or listening to a book discuss it with your child. Ask questions about the characters, setting, and plot (problem/solution). This helps to develop your child's oral language skills.

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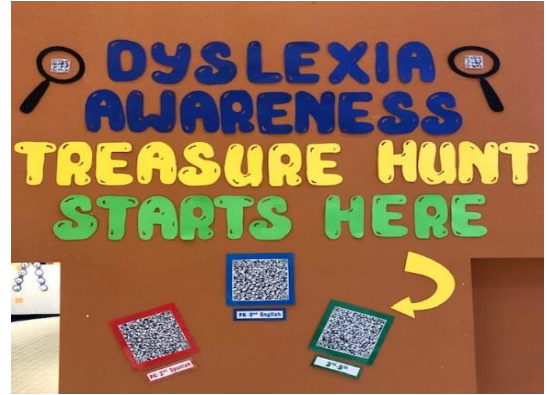
